Future organisational relation of ISAF RSD to ISAF

In response to your e-mail we would like to put forward the following views

- • ISAF RSD should be able to continue as a self administrated international organisation.
- • The organisation of more than one class in one overall organisation has been proven as effective and efficient. Splitting in more than one body will be very inefficient
- • One IRSA can help ISAF with radiosailing matters, (e.g. appendix E) when divided in separate ICA's overall, coordination is much harder and should have to develop.
- • Only those things should be changes that are necessary to get to the goal of fitting in the official structure.
- • The model with more than one class has proven itself. Not only internationally, but also at a national scale. NEMOZO as NCA for radiosailing classes also supports all recognised classes. It proves to be good to promote radiosailing under "bigboat sailors". Aspirant members will develop their own preferences and will choose a boat in the class most liked by them.
- • With one organisation as international body, NCA's will have to deal with one, instead of one for every class.
- • A lot of sailors in classes with relative little competitors do sail in "bigger" classes. Membership and administration is in one hand.
- • The option of an ICA for every class has the risk of putting attention and energy to the profiling of single classes ("fishing in the same pond") instead of profiling radiosailing against other kinds of sailing or other sports (getting new entrants).

We thereby support the option for changing ISAF RSD to an International RadioSailing Association. A big advantage on top of all mentioned above is that only little has to change. We should bear in mind that changing and getting used to a new structure will take years.
